Covid Update - how do the most recent changes affect school?

As you will have seen in the news, a positive lateral flow test no longer has to be confirmed with a PCR test. However, if your child has symptoms, please be aware that a *negative* lateral flow test is still not sufficient for them to come into school – **if they have symptoms, children still need a PCR test** to confirm that they do not have Covid, before they can return to school. Apologies for any inconvenience this causes, and thank you again for your support!

On a positive note, children who *do* test positive may return to school as early as day 8, if their lateral flow tests on day 6 and day 7 are negative. Congratulations if you've managed to follow all that! This would all have sounded like a foreign language a couple of years ago, I know! If you're in any doubt whatsoever, please don't hesitate to call.

We still update out Covid risk assessment regularly; this can be found on the school website.
