#### Academy Update



#### Our Grass!

You may have noticed that our grass is looking a little worse for wear. Unfortunately, our lovely grounds have been hit by an infestation of chafer grubs. Some of you may be familiar with these, as there seem to have been lots of cases locally over the last few years. The grubs have the annoying habit of eating the root system of grass, meaning that it's slowly eroded from underneath. I'm afraid to say that we have hundreds of thousands of them underneath our field. They're perfectly harmless (apart from their impact on the grass), but this unfortunately means we can't use the grounds as we normally would at the moment, because the grass comes up very easily and becomes a mudbath. For example, we're trying to avoid using the field for PE. We're working with the local authority's grounds maintenance team, but this may be a problem that takes quite some time to fix. We'll keep you updated!

#### Breakfast and After School Club pricing

A reminder that the price of Breakfast Club has now risen to £2.75 (an increase of 20p) and After School Club has risen to £8.00 (an increase of 30p). We work very hard to keep prices as low as possible, but unfortunately this increase has been necessary to combat rising costs.
