This will be a simple directory (like the Yellow Pages, for those who remember it!). It will be completely free and will provide a network of local tradespeople and small businesses, which we hope will be useful for the school community. All we ask is that:

- the business is owned by a parent / carer / grandparent of a child at Greenlands;
- you or a family member aren't employed by the school.

If you'd like to be included in our directory (for free!) please email school (AGP-office@nclt.ac.uk) with:

- Your business / company name;
- Your child's name (this will **not** be included in the directory it's just to make sure we only receive entries from people who have children with us!)
- A very brief description of what you do please note that this is a directory and **not** an advert, so this will simply appear as e.g. *electrician*, or *electrician rewires*, *lighting*, *fuse board installation etc.* and will **not** include any other promotional information.
- Your contact details (phone number or email address please remember that this will be visible to all parents via the newsletter)
- Your website / Checkatrade link or similar, if you have one.

Please note that this will be a very simple directory and will not have space for adverts or any other information. Inclusion in the directory will not indicate any kind of recommendation from school, and parents using it should still refer to any other sources (e.g. Google / Checkatrade) if they wish to check reviews / recommendations. It might be a big success or a total flop, but it's worth a try to find out! Watch this space!

Moving Up Morning

On Tuesday Ist July, there will be an opportunity for children to meet their new teacher and visit their new classroom. We're lucky in school that children often already know next year's teacher fairly well, but this is always a great opportunity for us to make sure children are feeling settled and confident ahead of next year.

Free School Meals

We have recently signed up to a new programme that should take the hassle out of applying for Free Schools Meals for parents. Reminder - School Shoes

Easier all round if we keep things simple and stick to plain black! Thank you for your support with this.

A reminder that Monday 14th July until the end of the year will once again be non-uniform, so that we can run our uniform swap shop! On Monday 14th, please bring in any clean, good quality school clothes that your child has outgrown. We will then have these available from Tuesday onwards, arranged by size, to be rehomed. Over the last two years we've rehomed hundreds of pieces of uniform, which is good for the planet and everyone's wallet!

New Mental Health Service from the NHS

We have today received this information from the NHS about a new service they are providing:

Text 'EYUP' to 85258 for support

This new service offers urgent mental health support by text message to people in South Yorkshire. The service – a partnership between NHS South Yorkshire and innovative digital service Shout, which is powered by the charity Mental Health Innovations – offers free, confidential, 24/7 text support for anyone struggling to cope.

Anyone in the area experiencing anxiety, stress, loneliness, depression, self-harm, suicidal thoughts, or other mental health challenges can use the service by texting the word 'EYUP' to 85258 at any time of day or night.

The text service is designed to provide anonymous support for people who need urgent mental health assistance. The service ensures patients can access help, day or night, without having to wait to speak to someone face-to-face or on the telephone. As well as providing support to members of the public, it also helps ease pressures on mental health services.

From 27 May, to start a conversation:

- Text the word 'EYUP' to 85258
- You'll receive four automated messages before being connected to one of Shout's qualified mental health professionals
- Once connected, the mental health professional will listen empathetically, provide support and signpost to local services where appropriate

The Shout service is free, anonymous, and does not appear on phone bills. Users do not need to register, download an app, or use mobile data.
