Uniform Swap Shop

Monday 14th - Please send in any clean, good quality uniform that your children have grown out of or longer need. If possible, please send this in a bag, labelled by size. **From Monday onwards, children do not need to come in uniform.** This includes PE days, when anything sporty (or easy to run around in) is fine to wear.

Tuesday to Friday (or as long as stock lasts) - All donated uniform will be available for FREE at the start and end of each day, on the infant yard. If the weather is bad, we will move the tables inside the hall.

Reminder - School Shoes

Before we come back to school after the holidays, many parents will be dragging children round shoe shops to replace outgrown school shoes (not a job I relish with my own children!) With this in mind, I'd like to take the opportunity to remind everyone that our uniform is **black shoes or trainers**, and that we do ask for children not to wear brightly coloured trainers. This may seem like an arbitrary request, but in the past we've found that it can lead to unkind comments between children if some come in expensive / name brand trainers and others don't. Easier all round if we keep things simple and stick to plain black! **Please note that we will be enforcing this as a school rule again after the holidays.** Thank you for your support with this.

- A very brief description of what you do please note that this is a directory and **not** an advert, so this will simply appear as e.g. electrician, or electrician rewires, lighting, fuse board installation etc. and will **not** include any other promotional information.
- Your contact details (phone number or email address please remember that this will be visible to all parents via the newsletter)
- Your website / Checkatrade link or similar, if you have one.

Please note that this will be a very simple directory and will not have space for adverts or any other information. Inclusion in the directory will not indicate any kind of recommendation from school, and parents using it should still refer to any other sources (e.g. Google / Checkatrade) if they wish to check reviews / recommendations. It might be a big success or a total flop, but it's worth a try to find out! Watch this space!
